Telling the time in Spanish

<i>A eso de</i>	At around
<i>A la una</i>	At one o'clock
<i>A las dos</i>	At two o'clock
<i>A las ocho</i>	At eight o'clock
<i>A las nueve</i>	At nine o'clock
<i>A las diez</i>	At ten o'clock
<i>A las tres y cinco</i>	At <u>five</u> minutes past three
<i>A las tres y cuarto</i>	At <u>quarter</u> past three
<i>A las tres y cuatro</i>	At <u>four</u> minutes past three
<i>A las tres y quince</i>	At <u>fifteen</u> minutes past three
<i>A las tres y media</i>	At <u>half</u> past three
<i>A las ocho menos cinco</i>	At <u>five</u> to eight
<i>A las ocho menos quince</i>	At <u>fifteen</u> minutes to eight
<i>A las ocho menos cuarto</i>	At <u>quarter</u> to eight
<i>A las ocho menos cuatro</i>	At <u>four</u> minutes to eight
<i>A mediodía</i>	At midday
<i>A medianoche</i>	At midnight

Time phrases

<i>Los lunes</i>	on Mondays
<i>Los martes</i>	on Tuesdays
<i>Los miércoles</i>	on Wednesdays
<i>Los jueves</i>	On Thursdays
<i>Los viernes</i>	On Fridays
<i>Los sábados</i>	On Saturdays
<i>Los domingos</i>	On Sundays
<i>Durante la semana</i>	During the week
<i>Durante el fin de semana</i>	During the weekend
<i>De la mañana</i>	in the morning
<i>De la tarde</i>	in the evening
<i>De la noche</i>	At night
<i>Por lo general</i>	generally
<i>Todos los días</i>	Every day
<i>Cada día</i>	Each day
<i>Normalmente</i>	Normally
<i>Primero</i>	First
<i>Luego</i>	Then/next
<i>Después</i>	After
<i>Finalmente</i>	Finally

Daily activities

<i>Almuerzo</i>	I have lunch
<i>Almorzar</i>	to have (having) lunch
<i>Ceno</i>	I have dinner
<i>Cenar</i>	to have (having) dinner
<i>Desayuno</i>	I have breakfast
<i>Desayunar</i>	to have (having) breakfast
<i>Descanso</i>	I rest
<i>Descansar</i>	to rest (resting)
<i>Hago mis deberes</i>	I do my homework
<i>Hacer mis deberes</i>	to do (doing) my homework
<i>Juego en el ordenador</i>	I play on the computer
<i>Jugar en el ordenador</i>	to play (playing) on the computer
<i>Me acuesto</i>	I go to bed
<i>Acostarme</i>	to go (going) to bed
<i>Me lavo los dientes</i>	I brush my teeth
<i>Lavarme los dientes</i>	to brush (brushing) my teeth
<i>Me levanto</i>	I get up
<i>Levantarme</i>	to get (getting) up
<i>Me visto</i>	I get dressed
<i>Vestirme</i>	to get (getting) dressed
<i>Salgo de casa</i>	I leave my house
<i>Salir de casa</i>	to leave (leaving) the house
<i>Voy al colegio en autobús</i>	I go to school by bus
<i>Ir al colegio en autobús</i>	to go (going) to school by bus
<i>Veo la tele</i>	I watch the telly
<i>Ver la tele</i>	to watch (watching) the telly
<i>Vuelvo a casa</i>	I go back home
<i>Volver a casa</i>	to go (going) back home

Below are some modal verbs – use verbs in the infinitive after these verbs

<i>Suelo</i>	I usually
<i>Me gusta</i>	I like
<i>Odio</i>	I hate
<i>Me encanta</i>	I love
<i>Prefiero</i>	I prefer
<i>Debo</i>	I must
<i>Tengo que</i>	I have to

Infinitives

The infinitive form is how you would find a verb in a dictionary – they are “to do” or “doing” words – e.g. *acostarme* – to go (going) to bed

Comer – to eat (eating)

Transport

<i>A pie</i>	on foot
<i>En bici</i>	by bike
<i>En coche</i>	by car
<i>En tren</i>	by train
<i>En avion</i>	by plane

Connectives

<i>Y</i>	and
<i>Pero</i>	but
<i>Porque</i>	because
<i>Además</i>	furthermore
<i>Sin embargo</i>	however
<i>También</i>	also
<i>Aunque</i>	even though

M words

<i>Más</i>	more
<i>Muy</i>	very
<i>Mucho</i>	a lot
<i>Más</i>	more
<i>Menos</i>	less
<i>Mejor</i>	better
