Congratulations to Jupiter House for their excellent end-of-year House Points win! House points systems are a fantastic way to promote teamwork, friendly competition, and positive behaviour among students. Our students have accrued a total of 76,267 positive house points since the House System launch in January! That's an incredible about of good, positive work by our excellent students.

In total, the school gave away over £1000 of 'Love to Shop' vouchers, alongside 'Jump the Queue' cards and a range of other privileges to students who won house draws from January to July.

The ways in which house points are awarded:

- Academic Achievements: High grades, outstanding performance in exams, or academic competitions can earn points for a house.
- Good Behaviour: Acts of kindness, respect for others, and demonstrating positive character traits contribute to gaining points.
- Extracurricular Activities: Participation and success in sports, arts, music, drama, or other school activities may lead to points.
- House Competitions: Students can compete in various contests or challenges representing their house during form time.

We are proud that our House Points are achievable for all by ensuring the following:

- Introducing New Activities: Adding fresh activities or events that cater to different interests through student voice.
- Inclusivity: Ensuring that house points are accessible to all students, regardless of their abilities or interests.
- Involvement of Students: Allowing students to have a say in creating and organising house competitions.
