CONTEXT

Palacio wrote Wonder after an incident where she and her three-year old son were waiting for ice cream. Her son noticed a girl with facial birth defects. Fearing he would react badly, Palacio attempted to move her son. This ended up making it worse. She wanted to write about this to try and teach society a valuable lesson.
