



The Course

You will learn about the English legal system which includes Parliamentary law making, delegated legislation and juries among other topics. You will also study the law surrounding offences against the person/property and the law on negligence, as well as public law and elements of human rights and EU Law. As the Law course consists of 100% exam, you can expect to practice your essay writing and examination skills very regularly. You will also learn to analyse and breakdown problems and develop your logical thinking skills. There is also an element of debate to your Law studies.

Assessment

You will take three written papers, each of which is worth 33% of your final grade for the A-Level.

Each paper is 2 hours long and consists of a combination of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing questions.
