'Unifrog is a complete destinations platform that provides students and teachers with a one-stop-shop for careers guidance. It helps students compare every college or sixth form, apprenticeships, university courses, and then apply successfully.'

Unifrog is used by over 3,500 schools in the UK!











Post-16 Pathways

The Value of Work Experience



The Speakers for Schools campaign – 'Work Experience for All' – has clear research recently to show that:

RAISES FUTURE SALARY

For each additional type of work experience done, future annual earnings increase by £1,088*

IMPROVES EMPLOYABILITY

Attending work experience reduces the chance of becoming NEET from 11 to 7%*

YET, 66% OF YOUNG PEOPLE CAN'T RECALL DOING ANY WORK EXPERIENCE BETWEEN THE AGES OF 16-18, AND PRIVATELY EDUCATED STUDENTS ARE TWICE AS LIKELY TO DO MULTIPLE PLACEMENTS AS STATE SCHOOL STUDENTS.*

Why do Work Experience in Year 10?

- Opportunity of Job Seeking: research and application
- Experience of Full-Time work
- Although it is unpaid it can 'open doors', some students have been rewarded for their engagement!
 Encourages discipline, adaptability, independence, self-confidence & resilience
- Teaches transferable skills e.g. problem solving, communication, teamwork, practical skills, organisation, networking
- Raises Aspirations
- Enhances your CV
- Can provide employment opportunities.....



What employers are suitable?

- ➤ Unless exempt, employers <u>MUST</u> have Employers Liability Insurance (ELI). A copy of the certificate will need to be seen before a placement is approved.
- Employers must be willing to complete the Unifrog Health & Safety questions or have an in-person visit to complete a Health & Safety questionnaire.
- > Offer a minimum of 4 hours a day, preferably for 5 days in any week.

Administration of Work Experience Placements

- ➤ All placements will be processed via the Unifrog Placement Tool
- > The majority will be processed automatically after being input by the student as they are low risk
- The school will monitor and can intervene manually if a placement seems higher risk or requires any additional assessments that Unifrog does not cover.

Why Have we Moved On-Line?

- To move with the times & streamline the paperwork!
- On-line processing will free up time for the school to try to find employers that may be able to offer placements and work with them to meet the needs of our students.



What next? Finding the Right Placement:

- > Talk to family and friends to see if they can offer a placement that your child will enjoy
- Think about Work Experience as a development of key skills rather than trying to find a job it doesn't have to link to what you want as a future career!
- > Try to think laterally about where skills can be developed E.g. if your child wishes to work in accountancy, all large companies will have an accounts department.
- ➤ Encourage your child to make the approach to the employer even if it means them writing an application to you first!
- ➤ Be positive and encourage your child in their search. This can be a very rewarding experience, but a lot depends on the student's approach to the work placement.
- Be able to cover any travel costs and expenses they may incur.
- > Have students return placements promptly so the approval process can begin.



How does the school help students find a placement?

- ➤ Year 10 Work Experience questionnaire on Unifrog for students to complete. Will help us match potential placements we find with the right student.
- > Weekly after-school assistance every Thursday between 3pm and 4pm.
- Computers / lunchtime assistance in IT4 to help students upload placements onto Unifrog.
- > Regular tutor group discussions.
- Contact staff if you need support! Email or find us in person!



Common Questions....

What if I am sick?

Both the employer and the school need to be informed of any sickness.

What if I don't enjoy what they ask me to do?

Most people will be asked to do something they do not enjoy in their work life. Make sure that you know the sort of tasks that you will be asked to do BEFORE you agree the placement. If you do not think that you will enjoy any of the work, think about looking for a different placement.

My mum/dad is working from home. Can I do my work experience with them?

Generally, the answer to this will be **No**, but talk to us about it. We also don't allow for virtual or online experience.

Do I have to do my work experience in the Southend area?

No. You are welcome to look outside of the area, in fact it is sometimes easier to find a placement. However, the school cannot fund travel costs and travel times should be considered when committing to a certain start or finish time to the day.



Common Questions....

How many hours do I need to do a day?

To get the most from your placement we suggest working at least 4 hours per day. You should not work more than 7 hours. A start time before 7am and a finish later than 9pm is considered 'unsociable' for the purposes of work experience and would require additional checks from the school.

I am being asked to work on a Saturday but have a day off in the week. Is this ok?

Yes, this is fine, but you should only be asked to work 5 days out of the week.

I need to attend an interview during school hours. Is this permitted?

Yes, we just ask that you inform the Attendance Office in advance.

Can I work with someone who is self-employed?

<u>Possibly-</u> The main concerns will be around Insurance and safeguarding. The employer must have EMPLOYERS LIABILITY INSURANCE (ELI). Many self-employed people do not require this, but some may have it. If you are unsure, the school is happy to speak to a potential employer to work out if a placement is suitable.
