There are **two** exams at the end of the two years course:

- Paper 1 (Theme 1) Investigating Small Business—
- Written examination (1 hour and 30 minutes) 50% of the qualification.
- Paper 2 (Theme 2) Building a Business-
- Written examination (1 hour and 30 minutes) 50% of the qualification.

Investigating Small Business

Theme 1 concentrates on the key business concepts, issues and skills involved in starting and running a small business. It provides a framework for you to explore core concepts through the lens of an entrepreneur setting up a business.

This theme will challenge you to apply a range of quantitative skills relevant to business contexts. This includes calculations and the interpretation, use and the limitations of quantitative and qualitative data.

<u>Building a Business</u>–

Theme 2 examines how a business develops beyond the start-up phase. It focuses on the key business concepts, issues and decisions used to grow a business, with emphasis on aspects of marketing, operations, finance and human resources. Theme 2 also considers the impact of the wider world on the decisions a business makes as it grows.

You will develop an understanding of the interdependent nature of business activity through interactions between business operations, finance, marketing and human resources, as well as the relationship between the business and the environment in which it operates.

- <u>Accounting Jobs</u>; Bookkeeper, Budget Analyst, Corporate Accountant or Tax Examiner
- <u>Business Marketing and Advertising Jobs</u>; Market Analysist, Media or Promotions Managers or Advertising or Sales Specialist.
- <u>Economics and Finance Jobs</u>; Financial Analyst, Loan/Insurance Underwriter or Stockbroker.
- Human Resources Jobs; Staffing or Recruitment Specialist, Training Manager or Human Resources Assistant.
- International Business Jobs; Trade Specialists, Import/Export Specialist or Foreign Service Officer.
