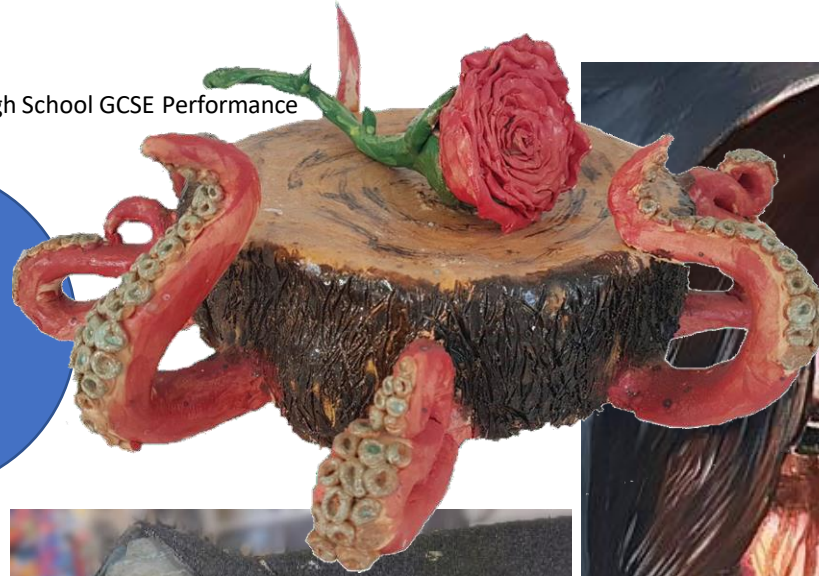

Subject Information:

Our exam board is AQA. The course is 60% coursework and 40% externally set assignment:

Coursework

- You will learn a wide range of new techniques, develop creative ideas, analyse others' art pieces and make 2D/3D artworks in Fine Art

Externally Set Assignment

- You will be given a topic and have ten weeks to develop ideas for an artwork. You will then have two days under exam conditions to make the final art piece.

You will learn how to:

- Develop original ideas
- Record your concepts visually
- Analyse the work of other artists and designers
- Present your work so that it has maximum impact
- Recognise the strengths and weaknesses of your work
- Use a wide range of materials and techniques skilfully

Materials and skills you will explore:

- **Fine Art:** pencil, watercolour, acrylic paint, oil pastel, chalk pastel, charcoal, ink, biro, clay, card, photoshop, photography, collage, colouring pencil.
