Never before has the arts played such an important role in our lives, the past few years has taught us that we need creativity to help keep us motivated, to inspire us, to entertain us. We have used the arts as a way to connect with each other and let our hair down during what has been a very difficult time for us all.

Performing Arts is a course where you can study and use your **creative skills** to **learn, create** and **develop** a range of performances. This course is graded at Distinction*, Distinction, Merit, Pass (level 1 and level 2) and the emphasis is placed on **practical work** accompanied by a portfolio of knowledge which can be presented in a variety of ways, allowing you as a student to present your work in a way that suits you. There is one controlled assessment where students submit a series of logs and practical performance to the exam board.

While studying this course you will get the opportunity to study a range of different performances and experience the buzz of the creative world through workshops, visits and shows.

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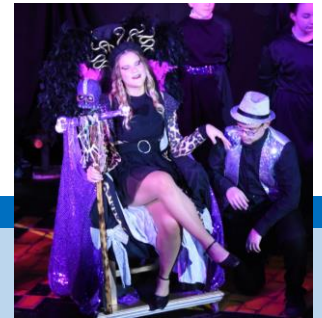

Which subjects were beneficial for specific skills?
Performing Arts – Acting, Singing, Dancing, Confidence and how to deal with written work. English – Shakespeare Business – To learn about finances and budgeting as well as maybe the opportunity to see if I could realistically put a business into my life plan. Catering – Always handy being able to cook! Maths – Numbers in life for being self employed and dealing with invoices and taxes.

What are your fondest memories of SHS?
All shows, classes and opportunities with Performing Arts! A few favourites were the Royal Albert Hall and Happy Days and of course Mamma Mia as my first production! I also loved being a part of the school sports team.

Do you have any words of advice for our students?
No matter what or who gets in your way, if you have a dream, chase it.

What skills do you use?
The skills I use in day to day life are very similar of work. Be a team player, be nice to everyone: it will be a better and have reflection on you. What skills do you use?
Singing! A musical skill that I developed throughout my time at Shoebury. This is what I chose to do for a career so with me luck! Other skills that help me navigate the business elements of the music industry are communication skills, effective collaborations with others, and as much as I hate it - maths does help with building a business in the real world. Like when I have to do my tax return.

Which subjects were beneficial for specific skills?
Music and Performing Arts was such a huge turning point for me. I wasn't naturally academic but my teachers helped me realise that performing and creating is what I wanted to do. On top of that as a songwriter English really helped me connect with words and allowed me to express myself. That 1 year of A level English of really did make a huge difference in my songwriting ability.

Do you have any words of advice for our students?
The only person you should compare yourself to is the person you were yesterday. Be bold. Don't change who you are for other people. Be unapologetically yourself and you will find your people.

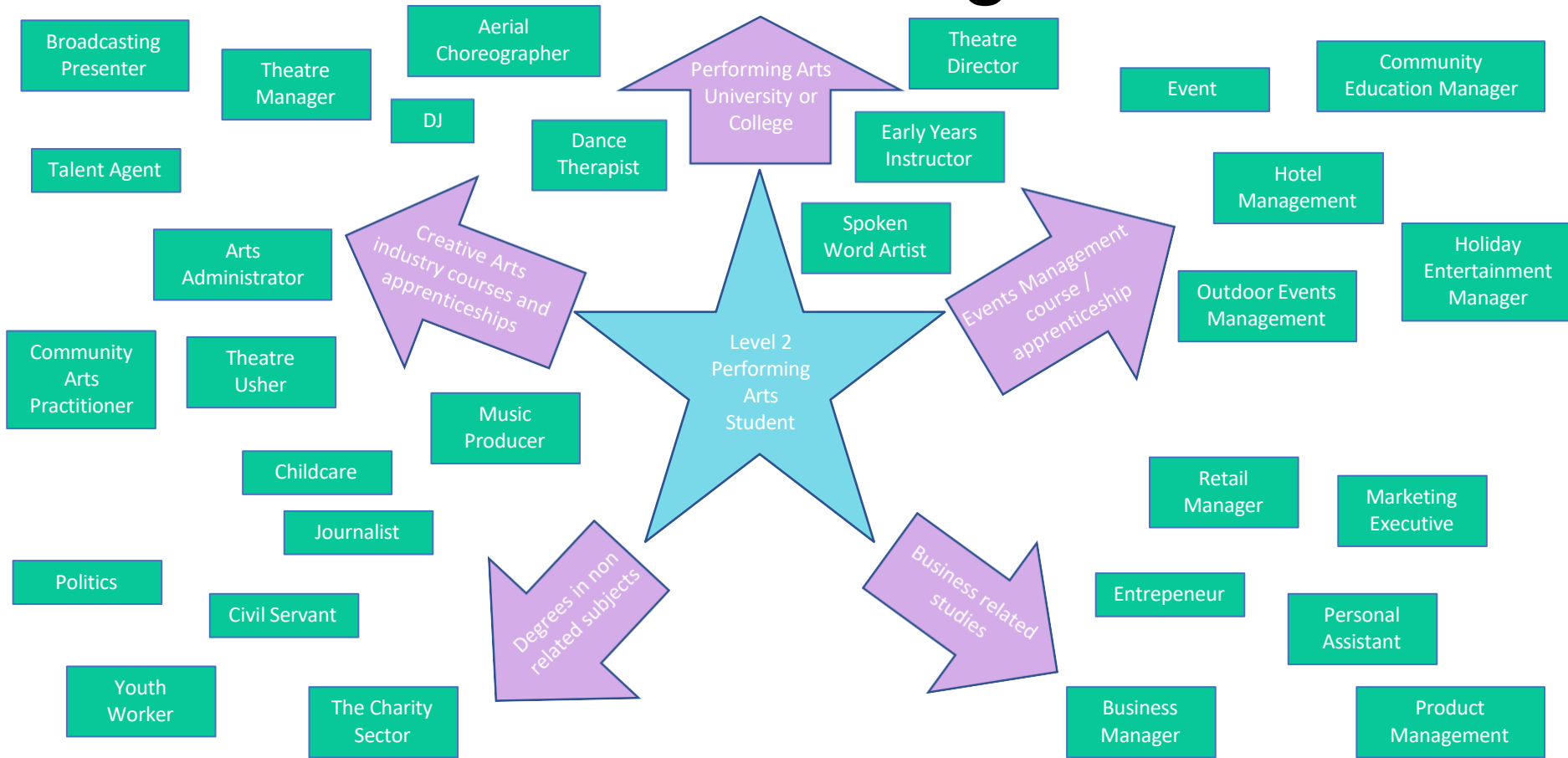

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Subject Information:

Our exam board is Pearson BTEC.

The course is 60% internally assessed and 40% externally assessed.

The course is graded from a level 1 Pass up to a level 2 Distinction*

Module structure

The course is split into a range of internally assessed units and one externally assessed unit.

Year 10 – You will study two units; Exploring the Performing Arts and Developing Skills and Techniques in the Performing Arts. The internal units are assessed through your practical work and portfolio of knowledge for each unit, the main focus of these units is to gain a broad range of practical experience and training within Performing Arts. These units are then marked by your class tutor and verified by the exam board.

Year 11 – After completing your internal units in year 10 you will then work on your externally assessed unit which is called Responding to a Brief. The external unit is split between practical work and logs/evaluations which are completed under controlled conditions. This work is then marked externally by the exam board.



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Subject Information

- You will study a wide range of units which look at a variety of skills within Performing Arts
- Practical skills will be developed within a range of disciplines, including acting, dancing and vocal
- Opportunities to create and perform live performances
- Develop skills in team work
- Communicate with peers to direct and collaborate together to create performances
- Study a range of live performance work
- Develop confidence skills which can be utilised throughout life, such as public speaking and interview techniques
- Workshops and visits from professionals within the Performing Arts industry, chance to watch live performance.
- Opportunity to perform within the school production and other school performances through Shoebury Dynamix Troupes.



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Who should take this course?

- If you are enthusiastic about Performing Arts then we want you!
- You don't have to be equally skilled in all areas but if you love acting, singing or dancing then this is the course for you.
- If you enjoy practical work then Performing Arts would be a perfect course for you to study.
- If you are looking for a subject to compliment your studies and want an opportunity to express yourself in a relaxed environment.
- If you like completing assessments throughout the two years without the pressure of one final exam at the end of year 11.
