### Assessment Scheme

A level Law is 100% examination. All papers consist of a combination of multiple choice, short answer and extended writing questions and each paper is worth 33% of your final grade.

**Paper 1:** The nature of law and the English legal system and Criminal law. This is a 2 hour written examination which is worth 33% of the final A Level grade.

**Paper 2:** The nature of law and the English legal system and tort. This is a 2 hour written examination which is worth 33% of the final A Level grade.

**Paper 3:** The nature of law and the English legal system and human rights. This is a 2 hour written examination which is worth 33% of the final A Level grade.

### Course expectations

- Complete a **minimum** of 5 hours independent study per week (see middle pages).
- Attend the after school study sessions - *compulsory if you are below your target grade*.
